He was an uncle of Dorothea Cordley Muth whose husband is a present member of Veterinary Medicine; and a brother-in-law of Prof. A. B. Cordley for whom Cordley Hall was named."]

"The visiting party of Oregon State college representatives at one of the receptions presented these Oregon-grown products, donated by merchants throughout the state, to their hosts as an emblem of Oregon hospitality.""]
